Dozens of exhibitors join EEAW with displays

■ **Protecting the Environment** — KSC is a beautiful facility with picturesque woodlands, landscapes and wildlife. The introduction of trash into KSC's environment tends to diminish the beauty and uniqueness of KSC. Additionally, the ingesting of some trash is often fatal to wildlife. Loose trash is blown about by winds and settles in the drainage ditches at KSC. Much of this trash comes from vehicles with open compartments such as pickup trucks. It is requested that each employee remove trash from vehicles with open compartments prior to driving onto KSC. Also, please deposit personal trash in appropriate trash receptacles.

■ **Did You Know?** The Department of Environmental Protection's Office of Greenways & Trails is pumping biodiesel, a new "green" fuel made from homegrown vegetables, vegetable oil, fats and grease, into its fleet of field trucks. The average truck travels more than 300 miles a week. Biodiesel yields 280 percent more energy than petroleum diesel fuel, while producing 47 percent lower exhaust emissions. Biodiesel is less combustible than petroleum diesel, as harmless as table salt and as biodegradable as sugar. Florida is planning on making mandatory in 2008 that all diesel sold in the state will have no sulfur and have at least 2 percent biodiesel mix for lubricity.
