

Work begins to add new safety system for Return to Flight


▲ **Shuttle Update:** Workers have begun installing wiring (see below) on the orbiter Discovery for the Orbiter Boom Sensor System. One of the new safety measures is equipping the Shuttle with cameras and laser systems to inspect the Shuttle exterior while in space.



▲ **ELV Update:** Retesting of the Delta II launch vehicle for the **Aura** spacecraft was successfully completed June 15 at Vandenberg AFB. **Aura** is ready to be moved to Space Launch Complex 2 on Friday.

Autonomy testing of **MESSENGER** is complete. Installation of thermal blankets continues. There are no technical issues or concerns with **MESSENGER** or its associated Delta II rocket at this time.
