




Stennis Space Center 2009 Economic Impact


Direct Global Economic Impact – \$875 Million



NASA's John C. Stennis Space Center is a significant source of employment and income in its local area. If Stennis had not been in operation in 2009, considering both direct and indirect effects, a very conservative estimate of reduction in employment for the local area would be almost 28,000 jobs; personal income would have been reduced by more than \$1.12 billion; and retail sales would have been reduced by \$609 million. It is estimated Stennis has an impact of \$90.2 million on local government tax revenue.

Direct Economic Impact 50-mile Radius \$668 Million




