Located near the Mississippi Gulf Coast in Hancock County, Stennis is home to hundreds of scientists, engineers, technicians and business professionals. It is a multidisciplinary center of 30 federal, state, academic and private organizations engaged in the areas of space, oceans, environmental programs and national defense and numerous technology-based companies.
