### Space dude

This robot toy action figure appeared on the Space Station. He or she stands guard to ensure that the stations robots are well cared for and used.



### Expedition 10 Patch

Each crew designs their own patch. Expedition 10 consisting of American Leroy Chiao and Russian Salizhan Sharipov spent 191 days on the space station between October 2004 and April 2005.



### Ships bell

The International Space Station continues the maritime tradition of ringing the ships bell to announce the arrival of a visiting craft. You can hear it ring when the Shuttle or Soyuz dock.



### Orlan Space suit

The Russian Orlan Space Suit is used by any crew member, whether they are Russian, American, European, Canadian or Japanese, when they go on spacewalks exiting through the Russian Pirs airlock.



### Dextre

The two-armed Canadian Dextre Special Purpose Dexterous Manipulator is picked up and attached to the station's large robotic arm for doing finely skilled tasks on the station's exterior.



### Crew Toilet Patch

This logo patch was conceived by the Waste and Hygiene Compartment team to show their pride in work.



### Russian Pirs hatch (external)

The Pirs airlock hatch is used by the crew when exiting and re-entering the station during Russian spacewalks. They always wear Russian Orlan spacesuits during these activities.



### Tennis shoes

The crew often float through the station in the stocking feet except when they exercise. One crew member took his tennis shoes off and left them tied to a handrail so they would not float off.



### Quest hatch (external)

The Quest airlock hatch is used by the crew when exiting and re-entering the station during US spacewalks. They always wear American Extravehicular Mobility Unit spacesuits during these activities.



### Handheld Camcorder

This is the handheld video camera used by the crew to shoot pictures inside the station.

Expedition 18 Commander Mike Fincke has his clothing bag stowed but easily accessible when needed.
