

Dimitar Sasselov is a professor of Astronomy at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass., director of the Harvard Origins of Life Initiative, and Senior Advisor of the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard. He holds a doctorate in Physics (1988) from Sofia, University, Bulgaria and a doctorate in Astronomy (1990) from University of Toronto, Canada. He was an Alfred P. Sloan Fellow (1999). His research explores the modes of interaction between light and matter, in stars and planets atmospheres, as well as the structure of their interiors. He has discovered several planets orbiting other stars with novel techniques that he hopes to use to find planets like Earth as a co-investigator of NASA's Kepler mission.
