SUBJECT: Determination Regarding Attendance by NASA employees at the Transformers: Dark of the Moon Premiere Post Party hosted by Chevy and Nokia on June 28, 2011

NASA invitees, accompanied by their spouse or a guest, may attend a the Transformers: Dark of the Moon Premiere Post Party, sponsored by Chevy and Nokia at the Edison Ballroom, 240 West 47th Street, New York, NY on June 28, 2011, at 10:30 PM. This event will provide NASA employees an opportunity to discuss the mission and other NASA programs with representatives of the communities participating in the event.

Approximately 800 people are expected to attend this event. Expected attendees include NASA personnel, representatives of other government agencies, the legislative branch, the aerospace industry, academia, the media, and the general public. The post party will include a buffet dinner, which will include dinner and refreshments valued at approximately \$187.50 per person. In accordance with 5 C.F.R. § 2635.204(g), and 14 C.F.R. § 1207.103, I find that the event meets the definition of a "widely attended gathering." I further find that there is an agency interest in having NASA employees attend the event, as they will have the opportunity to further agency programs and operations through the exchange of views and information with other attendees.

Accordingly, NASA employees who have been invited to attend may accept free attendance at the event. They may also accept invitations for accompanying spouses or guests.

However, NASA employees whose duties may substantially affect the sponsors, such as by way of procurement duties, should seek an individual determination pursuant to 5 C.F.R. § 2635.204(g)(3)(i) regarding participation in this event from their local ethics counselor.

Moreover, NASA employees who are in non-career positions for which they are required to sign an ethics pledge under Executive Order 13490 may only attend if they reimburse the sponsors the cost of the event for themselves and accompanying guests.
