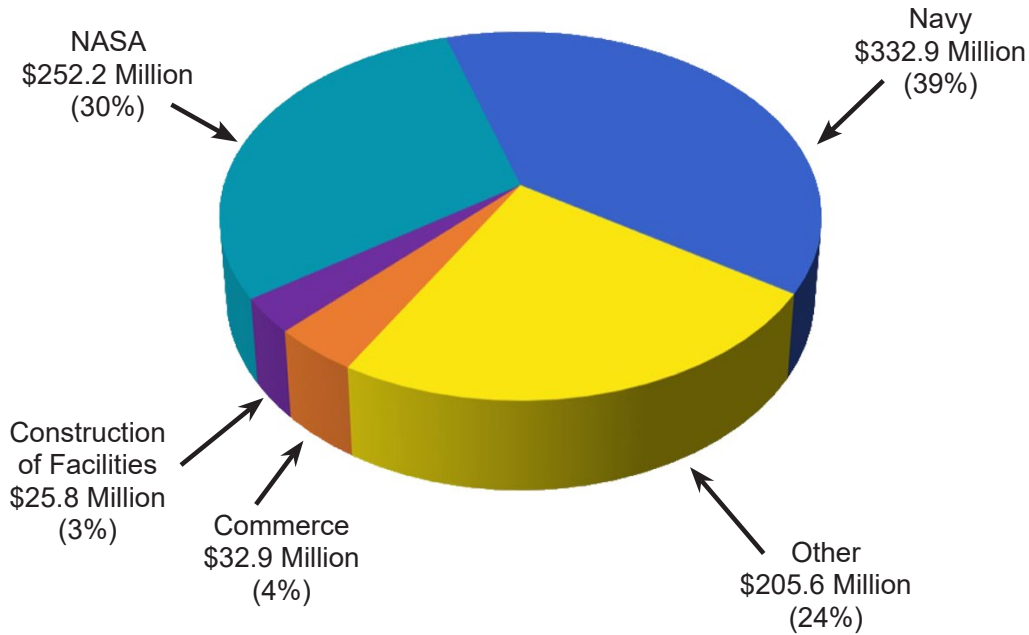




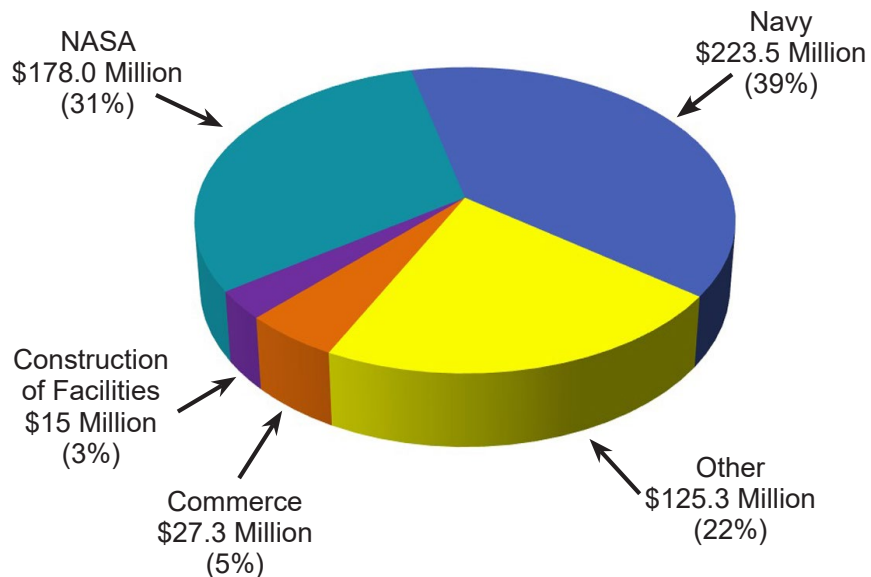
Direct Global Economic Impact \$849.4 Million



By any measure, Stennis Space Center is a major contributor to the Gulf Coast economies of Louisiana and Mississippi. While it is a national center for research, military logistics and applied science and receives federal funding, it spends more than 66 cents of every dollar within the local area of Hancock, Harrison and Pearl River counties in Mississippi and St. Tammany Parish in Louisiana (a 50-mile radius from the center). This resulted in Stennis contributing \$837,391,640 to the four county/parish economies in fiscal year 2019 alone.

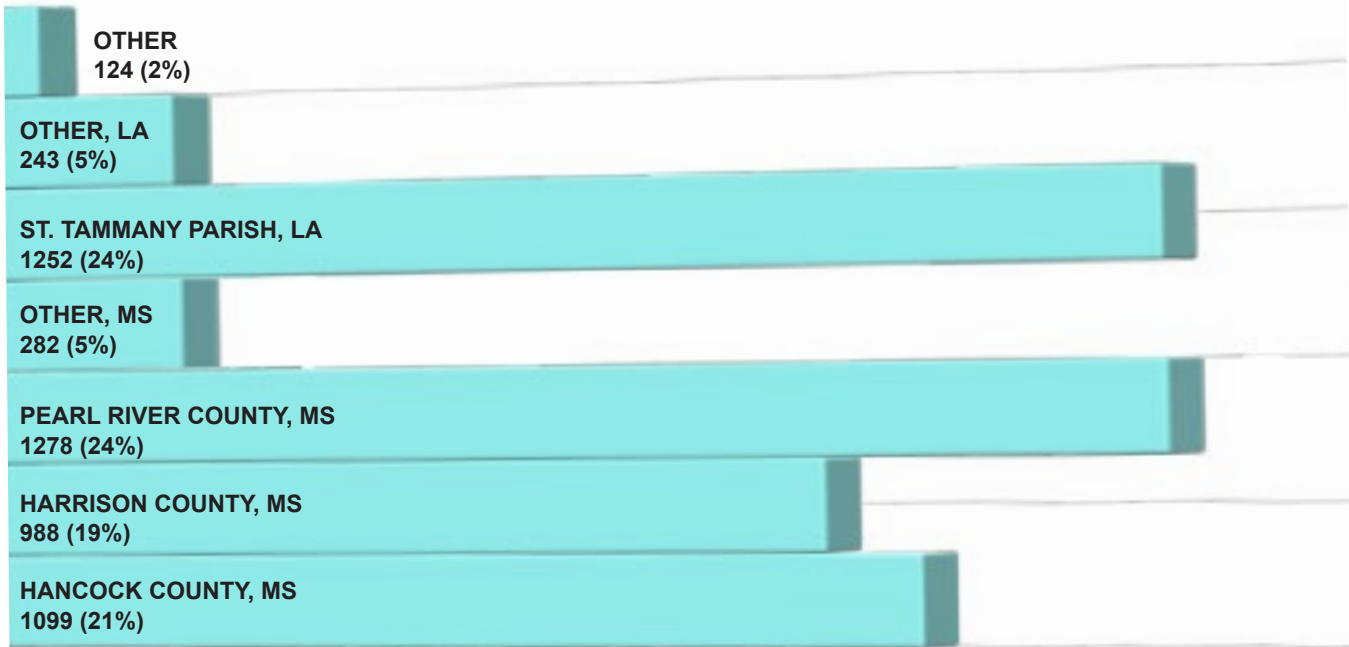
