1.2 Other News and Developments

1.2.1 Ammonium Nitrate Chemical Advisory

EPA, OSHA, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) [released](#) a [chemical advisory](#) for ammonium nitrate. The advisory contains information about the hazards associated with storing, handling, and managing ammonium nitrate and techniques to mitigate those hazards. Ammonium nitrate commonly is used in fertilizer and also may be found as a component of explosives and other energetic materials. The advisory was issued in support of [Executive Order 13650](#), "Improving Chemical Facility Safety and Security." Additional information is available on EPA's Risk Management Rule [website](#).

1.2.2 Proposed Amendments to the Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program

On 29 August 2013, EPA [announced](#) the availability of a [pre-publication version](#) of proposed amendments to the [Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program](#) (40 CFR Part 98). Proposed amendments that would affect record-keeping and reporting requirements, and also establish enhanced data verification procedures for confidential business information. The Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program collects and synthesizes GHG emission data from industrial emissions sources. On an annual basis, the Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program releases summaries and databases presenting U.S. GHG data. Additional information regarding the proposed amendments and a [fact sheet](#) are available on EPA's [website](#).

1.2.3 European Chemicals Agency Updates

As part of its implementation of the European Union's (EU's) regulation on the Registration, Evaluation, Authorization, and Restriction of Chemicals ([REACH](#)), the European Chemicals Agency ([ECHA](#)) is [soliciting](#) comments regarding 10 substances proposed to be identified as substances of very high concern ([SVHCs](#)).

Once added to the SVHC Candidate List for Authorization, substances could be considered for further evaluation for possible addition to REACH Annex XIV, Authorization. Substances included in the [Authorization List](#) require special authorization for continued manufacture and use in the EU after an assigned "sunset" date. Although such requirements do not affect operations in the U.S. directly, they can affect the global supply chain and reduce the availability of regulated

materials. The public comment deadline is 17 October 2013. The substances being proposed are as follows:
