SUBJECT: Guidance Regarding Attendance by NASA employees at the Ball Aerospace & Technologies Corporation Reception on December 2, 2014

On December 2, 2014, Ball Aerospace & Technologies Corporation will host a reception at the Ronald Reagan Building - Rotunda in Washington, D.C., at 5:30 p.m. The event provides an opportunity for attendees to share technological and programmatic developments potentially of mutual interest.

Approximately 600 people have been invited to attend, including members of Congress and staff, personnel from the media, academia, and industry, and employees of other Federal agencies.

Under the \$20 gift exception at 5 C.F.R. §2635.204(a), invited NASA employees (other than as explained below) may attend without reimbursing the host so long as they do not accept refreshments and gifts worth more than \$20 at the event, or worth more than \$50 from Ball under this exception during 2014. **Because the organizer's estimated per person value of food and refreshments is approximately \$35.00 to 50.00 per person, NASA employees attending should reimburse Ball the full value of the refreshments taken unless they consume nothing, or no more than a very light amount of fare estimated in good faith not to exceed \$20 in value.** Attendees are also reminded: 1) that it is never inappropriate and frequently prudent to reimburse a contractor host for the value of attending even if reimbursement is not required, 2) to ensure that their attendance does not generate any appearance of impropriety, such as appearance of preference or endorsement, and 3) they may contact a local NASA ethics official for advice.

Moreover, non-career NASA employees subject to the ethics pledge under Executive Order 13490 may only attend if they reimburse Ball the full value of any refreshments consumed or gifts accepted, even if none of the caps above are exceeded.
