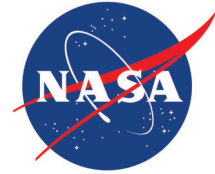

SUBJECT: Determination Regarding Attendance by NASA Employees at the 2025 Space Heroes and Legends Awards Dinner

On April 25th, 2025, the National Space Club Florida Committee, will host a reception and dinner at the Kennedy Space Center Visitor Center in Merritt Island, FL. The event is celebrating the 2024 Space Heroes and Legends Awardee.

The hosts have invited approximately 230 persons to attend. Attendees will have a diversity of views or interests and will include representatives from local aerospace companies, the Air Force, and NASA; elected officials; industry leaders; and one guest per each of the invitees. The estimated cost of the event, including all food and beverages, is \$120 per person. The National Space Club Florida Committee is the primary organizer, and contractors ASRC Federal, Axient, Boeing, Chenega Infinity, Delaware North, Leidos, Jacobs, Lockheed Martin, and ULA are sponsors for the event. Attendance at this event will allow NASA attendees to exchange information regarding various NASA programs with non-NASA attendees. I find that the event meets the requirements of a “widely attended gathering” as defined in 5 C.F.R. § 2635.204(g)(2).

I further determine that there is an Agency interest in having NASA personnel attend the event because it will provide an opportunity for the invited persons to exchange ideas and views pertaining to NASA's policies, programs, and operations.

NASA employees who do not have a significant role in a matter affecting the interests of the sponsors may accept an invitation for free attendance for themselves and a guest to the event. In those circumstances, I find that the Agency's interest in attendance outweighs any concern that the individual may be, or may appear to be, improperly influenced in the performance of his or her duties.

NASA employees who have a significant role in any pending matter affecting the interests of ASRC Federal, Axient, Boeing, Chenega Infinity, Delaware North, Leidos, Jacobs, Lockheed Martin, and ULA, such as procurement duties, program management, or negotiating or administering a Space Act Agreement, should seek a separate determination from their local

ethics counselor as to whether they may accept the invitation.

You are reminded of the \$20 gift exception at 5 C.F.R. § 2635.204(a), which provides that employees may accept gifts valued at no more than \$20 for each occasion (and no more than \$50 from one source in a calendar year). Employees may accept any item(s) that are under or at the \$20 gift exception rule.
