There are 4 NASA federal employees and 208 contractors* in the state of Wisconsin.

For every NASA civil servant job located in Wisconsin, an additional 86** jobs are supported in the state economy. For every million dollars' worth of economic output generated by NASA civil service employees, an additional \$39.3** million worth of output is sustained throughout the state economy.
