

### **NASA JOBS SUPPORTED**

There are 3 NASA federal employees and 11 contractors\* in the state of Wyoming.

For every NASA civil servant job located in Wyoming, an additional 6\*\* jobs are supported in the state economy. For every million dollars' worth of economic output generated by NASA civil service employees, an additional \$2.6\*\* million worth of output is sustained throughout the state economy.
