It's time to take a trip again, back to the Moon — and more.


It's time to get things ready now, so let's begin our tour!




We call them EGS for short.
They build and launch our rocket.


They help Orion get back home, and test each piece and sprocket.





Let's huddle up to start our tour! Let's kick it into gear! There's lots for you to see today — it all begins right here ...






The Vehicle Assembly Building is where it all gets built —

a place so tall, you might see clouds, in patches like a quilt.


When all the rocket parts get here, a team of folks unpack 'em.

Let's move along — it's almost time!


The launch is starting soon!
